

Serious questions which have not been answered:

All these items incur costs which will not be covered by grant, yet rather by town's police department:

1. • Who watches the dog when dog officer may be on dates, vacation or other personal time?
2. • Besides the on duty liability insurance to cover dog when on duty, who vets and approves the added liability for when it is at home with dog officer, and what are the requirements for the people around the dog when the dog is "off duty"
3. • Who pays the overtime to cover dog officer's shifts when he's in training, up to 12 weeks yearly, with the dog?
4. • When the dog and officer are called to another town, does the town get reimbursed for the town's lost time? Dog Officer's replacement overtime salary + dog officer's salary + travel expenses+ vet expenses should dog get injured in another town.
5. • How will the police department cover the town when dog officer gets called off to another town? Who covers overtime when dog officer and dog called to another town? And how will it be handled, if the dog officer is called off, has there been a clear plan developed to provide coverage immediately or will the Town be short an officer?
6. • Since the town averages 3-4 K-9 calls a year, what does the dog do all the remaining 200+ shifts it won't be needed in Warren
7. • Car- a designated car needed – since chief wants new car, will town need to buy 1 for dog and 1 for chief?
8. • What happens to the dog is the dog officer is no longer able to perform his duties, for whatever reasons.

Most importantly- does the town currently reimburse any of the above items to the agencies which have supplies dogs to the town over the past few years, and if so, what is the average cost per call vs what the town will be absorbing so that Joe LaFlower Jr can have a dog?
